



The Environment Rating Scales (ERS) are observation tools that assess the quality of interactions between adults and children, including classroom schedules, materials and spaces available and accessible to children. The use of ERS is a widely accepted method of evaluating and improving the quality of home- and center-based programs. The Infant/Toddler and the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scales are used in center/school based settings while the Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale is used in family childcare homes.
